## **Unsecured load leads to £1,000 fly-tipping fine for tradesman**

A £1,000 penalty issued to a tradesman has prompted us to remind people of your legal waste responsibilities when disposing of waste.

The Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) was issued after a builder's bag containing cardboard packaging was found fly-tipped on a grass verge on Whitehill Lane, near Brinkworth. When investigated by our Environmental Enforcement Officers, they were able to trace the waste back to a resident in Swindon.

### **Don't miss your chance to shape cycling and walking plans**

There is still time to help shape cycling and walking plans in Marlborough, Tidworth and Ludgershall, Malmesbury, Bradford on Avon and Westbury.

Views and ideas will be used to help create draft Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plans (LCWIPs) for each town. LCWIPs identify local cycling and walking networks and set out how these routes can be improved over time.

Once finalised, an LCWIP forms the basis for future cycling and walking improvements in that area. Crucially, it also helps to secure potential future funding from Active Travel England (ATE).

## Keep up-to-date with improvement works

Essential maintenance work will be taking place at Central Car Park in Salisbury on Wednesday 25 March, between 6am and 6pm.

During this time, several temporary changes will be in place:

- No through access will be available from Summerlock Approach (Fisherton Street) to Mill Stream Approach or Churchill Way via the car park.
- Three rows of parking bays and one coach bay will be temporarily suspended.
- Advance signage is being installed at the Summerlock Approach entrance and throughout the car park to help motorists plan ahead.
